LINE 134

APLC is near completion of construction on the Line 134 Project for TC Energy that consisted of pickup and relay of 4 miles of 10" steel pipeline in Western Pennsylvania. The company incurred NO OSHA recordable incidents on the project. Thank you to Superintendent, Mark Nail, Safety Lead, Benji Bordelon and the rest of the project team for meeting our primary goal of ensuring all employees left the project as safety and healthy as they showed up!

LEACH XPRESS

APLC is currently working on four spreads of the Leach XPress Project which consisted of slip repair and clean-up work throughout Ohio and West Virginia in 2019. With well over 200 employees on the project for the majority of the year, the project team maintained a safe work site at all times with no lost time cases all year long. Thank you Superintendent, Terry Frymier, Safety Lead, Michael Bostick and the rest of the project team for meeting our primary goal of ensuring all employees left the project as safety and healthy as they showed up!

MOUNTAINEER XPRESS

APLC is currently working on clean-up and slip repair on two spreads of the Mountaineer XPress Project. Each spread consisted of just over 22 miles of large diameter new mainline steel pipeline installation that was layed in 2018. APLC has yet to incur a lost time case or a recordable injury on the project in 2019. TRIR UPDATE

APLC is on track for the best safety statistical year that the company has ever recorded. The company is on track to finish the calendar year well under the industry average with TRIR and LTCR for the 7th consecutive year.

FALL SAFETY TIPS

With summer behind us and fall now in full force, the changing of weather and the upcoming holidays are present and on all of our minds. This brings a different set of risks and hazards that we all must be mindful of. Many of our Associated family members have children that will be excitedly putting on costumes and be trick-or-treating. Please share the following tips with your families to ensure their safety on that special day. We all drive vehicles and the dangers of fall driving are present at this time of year. Please review the following tips and practice caution and awareness when we drive without distraction on the jobsite and away from it as well.



Children love the magic of Halloween but for parents there is a fine line between Halloween fun and safety concerns. Please follow these safety tips when preparing children for trick-or-treating and if you plan on driving on Halloween night:

When they are on the prowl:

- A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds.
- If you older children are going alone, plan and review a route acceptable route to you.
- Agree on a specific time children should return home.
- Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car.
- Instruct children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends.
- Tell you children not to eat treats until they return home.
- Children and adults are reminded to put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.

Safety Tips for Motorists on Halloween:

- Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully.
- At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing.
- Discourage inexperienced drivers from driving.



The fall season means shorter days and less daylight which brings additional safety issues. Please follow these safety tips for fall driving at times to mitigate risk in the most danger task that you completely every day – driving to, during and home from work:

Factors to be aware of when driving in the dark:

- The risk of a fatal crash is three times greater at night.
- Depth perception, color recognition and peripheral vision can be compromised in the dark.
- The glare of headlights from an oncoming car can temporarily blind a driver.

Tips for driving in the dark:

- Be sure your headlights are aimed correctly.
- Look away from oncoming lights.
- Ensure your vehicle receives regular maintenance and windshield is clean.
- Maintain safe speed and increase distance from the vehicle ahead of you.

Other things to be aware of when driving in the fall:

- Fallen leaves can cause slippery driving conditions.
- Fall means back-to-school; watch out for school children at bus stops.
- Watch for deer and other animals who are more likely to run into the road during the fall.

Every 7 seconds, a worker is injured in the USA. Complacency can be a contributing factor in many of these injuries. It is one of the most pressing issues in the workplace today and especially at the end of projects. Please following these tips at all times:



- Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings at all times.



- Before starting a task, think about potential hazards and how to protect yourself.



- Always pay full attention to the task at hand.



- Report unsafe conditions and near misses to your supervisor.



- Watch out for the safety of your co-workers.



- Don't take shortcuts that would compromise safety and watch out for others who become complacent, take short cuts or demonstrate at-risk behaviors.
